

SHOULD INCLUDE IN
DETAIL PART OF ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 3

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A POLICE DEPARTMENT IN
AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF INDIAN LAKE, SOMERSET COUNTY,
PENNSYLVANIA

The Borough of Indian Lake hereby ordains as follows:

SECTION 1: A Police Department is hereby established in
and for the Borough of Indian Lake.

SECTION 2: The Council of the Borough of Indian Lake shall
appoint and remove Borough Policemen. The Council may designate one
policeman as Chief of Police. The Council shall determine the total
weekly hours of employment that shall apply to the policemen. The
Council may also assign the Chief of Police or any member of the Police
Force to undergo a course of training and may provide for payment by the
Borough of Indian Lake for his expenses while undergoing said training.
The Council shall fix the compensation to be received by said Policemen.
The Council shall further provide appropriate badges, uniforms, and
equipment for said policemen.

SECTION 3: The Mayor of the Borough of Indian Lake shall have
full charge and control of the Chief of Police and the Police Force, and
he shall direct the time during which, the place where, and the manner in
which the aforesaid Chief of Police and Police Force shall perform their
duties. He may also suspend any Policeman for cause and without pay
until the succeeding regular meeting of the Council at which time the
Council shall hear and determine the appropriate action to be taken.

SECTION 4: DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE POLICEMEN. The Chief of
Police and the Patrolmen are hereby exofficio constables of the Borough

and shall, within the Borough, without warrent and upon view, arrest and commit for hearing any and all persons guilty of breach of the peace, vagrancy, nuisance, or disorderly conduct or drunkenness or who may be engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending to impair the personal security or endanger the property of the citizens or for violating any Ordinance of the Borough for the violation of which a fine or penalty is imposed and notwithstanding any statute pertaining to the same or similar offenses. When necessary any such persons so arrested may be confined by the said Policemen in the Somerset County Jail. Policemen shall have authority to serve and execute all criminal processes for the violation of Borough Ordinances which may be issued by the Mayor. Policemen, including the Chief of Police, have the further authority to prevent crime.

The above Ordinance having been approved for publication and having been advertised for the proper period as provided by law is hereby approved on this 5th day of May, 1967, by the majority of the Council of the Borough of Indian Lake.
