RESOLUTION FOR PLAN REVISION

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF INDIAN LAKE BOROUGH, SOMERSET COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA (hereinafter "the municipality").

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Act of January 24, 1936, P.L. 1635, known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act", as Amended, and the Rules and Regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (Department) adopted thereunder, Chapter 71 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Code, require the municipality to adopt an Official Sewage Facilities Plan providing for sewage services adequate to prevent contamination of waters of the Commonwealth and/or environmental health hazards from sewage wastes, and to revise said plan whenever it is necessary to determine whether a proposed method of sewage disposal conforms to a comprehensive program of pollution control and water quality management, and

WHEREAS, Richard Chataik, 943 Peninsula Drive) proposes the use of a small flow sewage treatment facility to replace an existing malfunctioning on-lot sewage system with a discharge to groundwaters using a pressure-dosed At-Grade Bed, which Borough Council by Resolution 2002-8, approved on August 14, 2002,

WHEREAS, James and Phyllis Everts (lot # 170 Peninsula Drive) and Jane Sitt (lot # 171 Peninsula Drive) propose the use of small flow sewage treatment facilities to serve two proposed residential dwellings with discharges to groundwaters using pressure-dosed At-Grade-Beds, which Borough Council by Resolutions 2002-3 and 2002-4, approved on April 24 2002.

WHEREAS, Richard Chataik, James and Phyllis Everts and Jane Sitt have requested Indian Lake Borough Council approval of Lake discharges for the treated effluent from the proposed small flow sewage treatment facilities should the proposed At-Grade-Beds fail to perform as anticipated

WHEREAS, Indian Lake Borough finds that the lake discharge requests as a potential alternative to the proposed At-Grade-Beds conforms to applicable sewage-related zoning and other sewage-related municipal ordinances and plans, and to a comprehensive program of pollution control and water quality management.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Council of Indian Lake Borough hereby adopts and submits to the Department of Environmental Protection this Resolution approving individual Lake discharges for the three proposed small flow sewage treatment facilities, should the proposed At-Grade-Beds fail to provide adequate disposal for the treated effluent
