BOAT INSPECTIONS

While this is a repeat, remember that if you are bringing a new boat (includes non-powered boats such as kayacks, canoes, as well as sail boats) onto Indian Lake, that boat must be inspected and measured for length by the Police Department in order to receive a Indian Lake Boat Permit sticker. To arrange to have your boat inspected, please contact the Police Department on the non-emergency line - (814) 754-3231. As our officers spend little time in the office, you will likely need to leave a message. You can expect an officer to return your call at the end of the current shift or at the beginning of the next. You may also e-mail your request to police@indianlakepa.us.
