

ORDINANCE NO. 67

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCES NO. 59 AND 61 OF THE BOROUGH OF INDIAN LAKE, SOMERSET COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REGULATING THE USE AND ENJOYMENT FOR RECREATIONAL AND OTHER PURPOSES OF INDIAN LAKE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Indian Lake, Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the authority of the same as follows:

ARTICLE I: The third sentence in Section 101 of Ordinance No. 59, which provides:

"Boats or other vessels or devices powered by any other source whatsoever, including, but not limited to, jet powered boats and houseboats, are prohibited and shall not be placed, operated or used in or upon the waters of Indian Lake."

is hereby amended to read as follows:

". . .Boats or other vessels or devices powered by any other source whatsoever, excluding jet skis, wet bikes and wind surfers, including but not limited to, jet powered boats and houseboats, are prohibited and should not be placed, operated or used in or upon the waters of Indian Lake."

ARTICLE II: The fourth sentence of Section 101 of Ordinance No. 59, as amended by Ordinance No. 61, providing:

"Beginning in the calendar year 1986 and continuing thereafter, no jet ski, wet bike, wind surfer type vessels or similar devices shall be permitted to be operated upon the waters of Indian Lake".

is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE III: Section 202 of Ordinance No. 59 is amended to add:

"(k) No sailboats, jet skis, wet bikes and wind surfers shall be operated on the waters of Indian Lake on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m."

ARTICLE IV: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
